Purpose:

At Canowindra High School, every student has the opportunity to be acknowledged in three areas: *Excellence, Respect & Responsibility* and *Participation*. This *Student Recognition Policy* allows for students to be acknowledged *immediately* with a *merit card*. Positive letters are also sent home for special recognition. Incentives including canteen vouchers and scholarships are awarded to students at different levels.

As a result of the 2010 Welfare Support Visit and surveys by staff and students, a need to 'revamp' the current system was identified. This *Student Recognition Policy* is based on the Core Values from the <u>Values</u> <u>in NSW Public Schools Policy 2004</u>.

The examples below are not an exhaustive list of reasons for each area. Teachers are required to complete the merit section (for student) and receipt section (for office). The receipt section is to be placed in the *Merit Box* in the office.


