

SCHOOL CONTRIBUTIONS - 2020

Purpose:

Each year parents are asked to pay a General School Contribution plus Subject Fees. These school contributions are used to buy equipment, materials and services in order to provide a high quality curriculum beyond that provided by basic government grants.

We ask that you help improve your child's learning opportunities by paying your contribution in 2019.

General School Contributions:

This is paid by all students each year. It is used to cover equipment, materials and services such as Ambulance insurance, photocopying, sports equipment and library resources.

Subject Fees:

Fees are charged for elective subjects in Years 9 to 12 and for practical subjects in Years 7 and 8, where consumable materials or specialist equipment and services are used for practical lessons. We try to keep these fees as low as possible. Where a subject fee has not been paid, the student may be limited in their access to materials in that course or may not be permitted to take completed practical work home. Non-payment of these fees will also affect participation in all non-curriculum based excursions.

Payment Options:

School contributions can be paid in a lump sum at the beginning of the year or they can be paid by instalment at the beginning of each semester, term, month or other arrangement.

Payment can be made by cash, cheque, eftpos or online payments through the school website.

Support may be available for families in genuine financial need who are unable to pay Subject Fees or who are unable to afford needed equipment and materials. Call the school to make an appointment with the Principal.
